



DID YOU KNOW...?

That it is possible for one un spayed female cat to be responsible for 20,000 kittens in just five years!

A female cat should be spayed at 6 months.

An un spayed queen cat may come into season three or four times a year. If un spayed she can have a litter of kittens at six months old, even though she is only a kitten herself. A tom cat is usually mature enough at six months to be neutered.

Spayed and neutered cats make much better pets. They are more home loving and less likely to wander. Neutered tom cats are also less likely to fight over territory or to spray.
